We hear these calls from time to time, and these folks come back and make another call.

They have issues.

On more than one occasion the call was completely bogus.

There was no 911 needed.

However, in doing our job. We take the call anyway, we pass that information on to the 911 and first responders.

The need for this is that we do not know if it's bogus call at the time.

We can only assume that it is bogus and we let the first responders sort out what is real or not.

Gather the information, give it to 911 so they can go out and determine if it's bogus.

You never know when something is going to escalate.

Remember to always take the call and fill out an incident report

and E-mail it to Mike and Richard

The initial incident report is used for the Colorado Emergency Reporting Net analytics.

It is also used for everyone's protection keeping a log of incident reports and if needed, we can get real-time copy of the call, which is recorded on www.Broadcastify.com and is archived in 1 hour blocks based on date and time.

<u>Buckhorn Mountian/Ft Collins</u> The repeater is on 146.730MHz with a -600 offset, the normal 88.5Hz input tone is needed. As with all of the repeaters if a party is experiencing local interference a 123Hz tone can be used on the receive side.
